Most of the work of the Church of England is carried out in the dioceses and parishes. But there are important functions which can only be carried out effectively at a national level. The Archbishops' Council was established in 1999 to strengthen the effectiveness of the Church's central policy and resource decision-making, helping the Church face the challenges of the future. The Council's statutory object is to co-ordinate, promote, aid and further the work and mission of the Church.

As one of its 19 members, you will help establish and develop the Council's strategic direction and goals and promote its policies.

6 of the members are appointed by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York. The Archbishops have chosen to run an open recruitment process to encourage applications as widely as possible from committed members of the Church of England or Churches Together.

We are looking for 2 individuals (one immediately and one in January 2007) who will be part of the leadership of the Church. Skills and experience in the areas of education, public affairs and law would be particularly welcome, but applications from people with a record of achievement in other areas are also welcome. You will have a lively Christian faith, be expected to contribute to the mission and ministry of the Church, and be able to commit at least 3 days per month.
